In times of violent political conflicts, the exhibition and conference explore the conjuring of specters as a proper method of arts-based research. They welcome the appearance of ghostly events, signs, images, practices and objects that recount the ferocities of the past while also holding the potentiality of a different future. Building on a glossary of hauntopic devices the exhibited works make use of formats that employ ephemeral, opaque or sci-fi elements and explore the range of a ghostly aesthetics.
